On behalf of the dedicated men and women of the Manchester Police Department, I am proud to present the 2025 Annual Report. This report reflects our continued commitment to ensuring Manchester remains a safe, welcoming, and thriving community for our residents, families, businesses, and seniors. The safety and security of our city are made possible through the professionalism and dedication of our employees, as well as the ongoing support of our Mayor, Board of Aldermen, and the citizens we serve.

Throughout 2025, we remained focused on strengthening public trust, enhancing transparency, and expanding community partnerships. We recognize that our mission can only be accomplished when we maintain the confidence and support of those who live, work, and visit Manchester. By investing in community engagement, modern training, and effective communication, we continue to build meaningful relationships that reinforce trust and mutual respect.

Our goal remains clear: **to uphold a transparent, accountable, and service-driven organization that works in true partnership with the community.** This 2025 Annual Report outlines the department's major initiatives, accomplishments, and operational highlights, along with detailed crime and traffic statistics. We believe this report provides a clear and accurate representation of our ongoing efforts and our unwavering dedication to protecting and serving the citizens of Manchester.

The Manchester Police Department successfully applied for and secured a grant from the Tennessee Department of Safety & Homeland Security to support our School Resource Officer (SRO) Program. This funding enabled us to continue our partnership with Manchester City Schools, ensuring a School Resource Officer is assigned to each city school for the third consecutive year under the grant program.

Furthermore, the department obtained two grants from the Tennessee Highway Safety Office (THSO) to enhance traffic enforcement during National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) enforcement events. For the 24-25 grant year, we were awarded \$60,000.00 to cover overtime hours and purchase necessary equipment. Our agency also received funding for body armor through the Department of Justice Bulletproof Vest Partnership (BVP). Additionally, we were awarded two new grants to support hiring, training, and recruitment efforts, which are secured through 2028.

In 2025, Officer Morgan Myers was honored as the Manchester Police Department's "Officer of the Year", while Officer Coty McMurtry received the prestigious "Captain Chris Patterson Memorial Award."

As in previous years, our agency remains committed to maintaining strong collaborative partnerships with organizations such as THSO, THP, the Coffee County Sheriff's Department, the Tullahoma Police Department, the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI), the Coffee County District Attorney General's Office, and various state and federal agencies.

Building and sustaining strong partnerships between law enforcement and the community is the foundation of our policing philosophy in Manchester. I sincerely appreciate everyone who collaborated with us over the past year to help protect and strengthen our city.

The Manchester Police Department had a successful 2025 year, and I am extremely proud of all we have accomplished. I am excited about the year ahead and look forward to further successes and achievements in 2026. This report reflects our department's continued dedication to ensuring that Manchester remains a safe place to visit and call home.

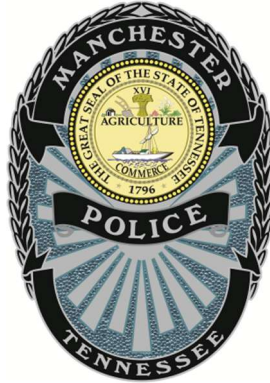

MISSION STATEMENT

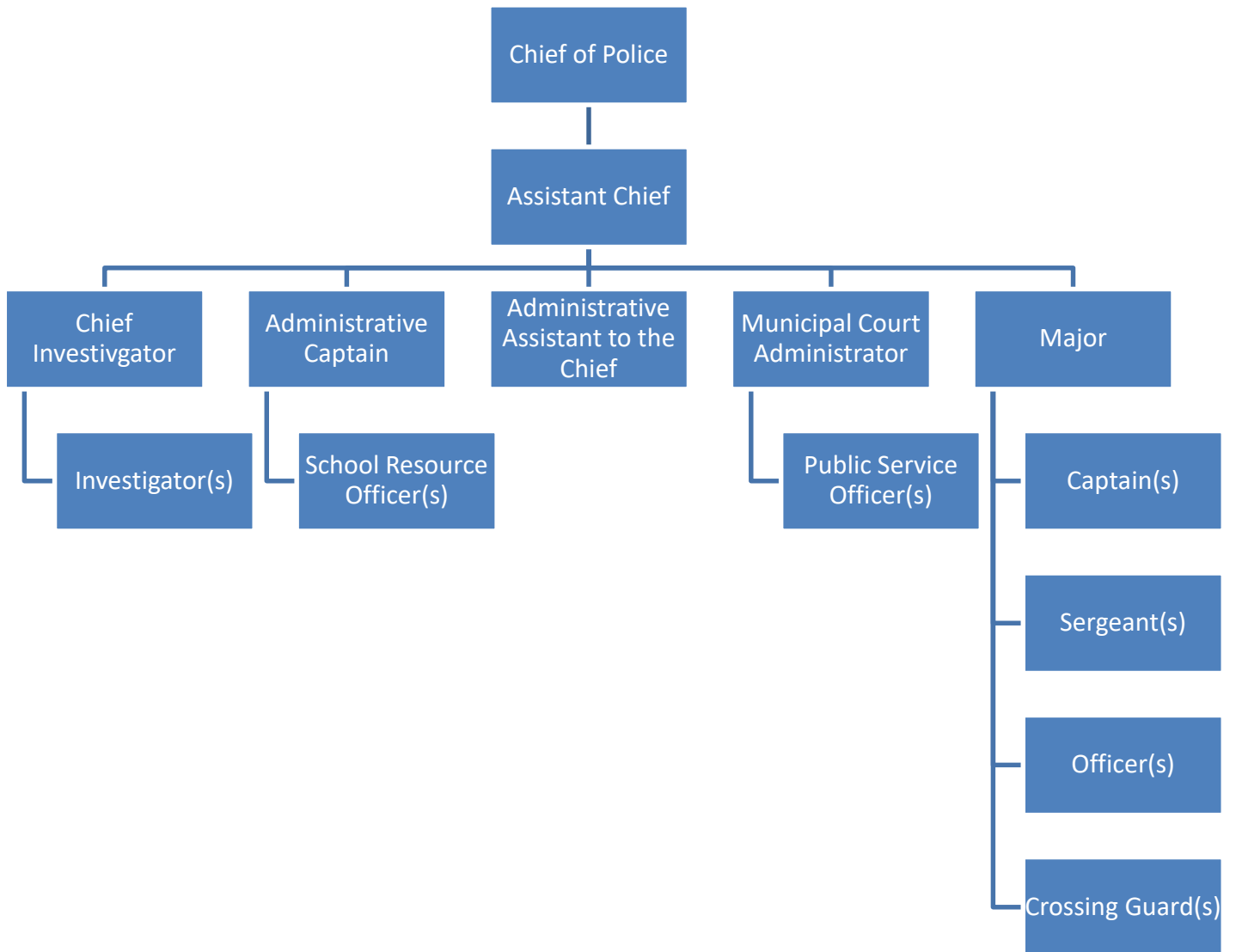

The Manchester Police Department Support Services is under the direction of the Assistant Chief. The support services staff is responsible for providing friendly customer service to the public and citizens of Manchester.

The Public Service Officers are the first line of contact inside the police department. They are responsible for assisting the public by taking basic reports, providing copies of incident / crash reports and collecting fines for traffic citations.

The Municipal Court Administrator oversees all management and administrative processes of our municipal court system. The administrator performs a range of day-to-day tasks including data processing, state reporting, and maintenance and preservation of all court records.

The Administrative Assistant is responsible for a variety of tasks that support the operation of the department including but not limited to all TIBRS reporting to the TBI and beer permit applications.

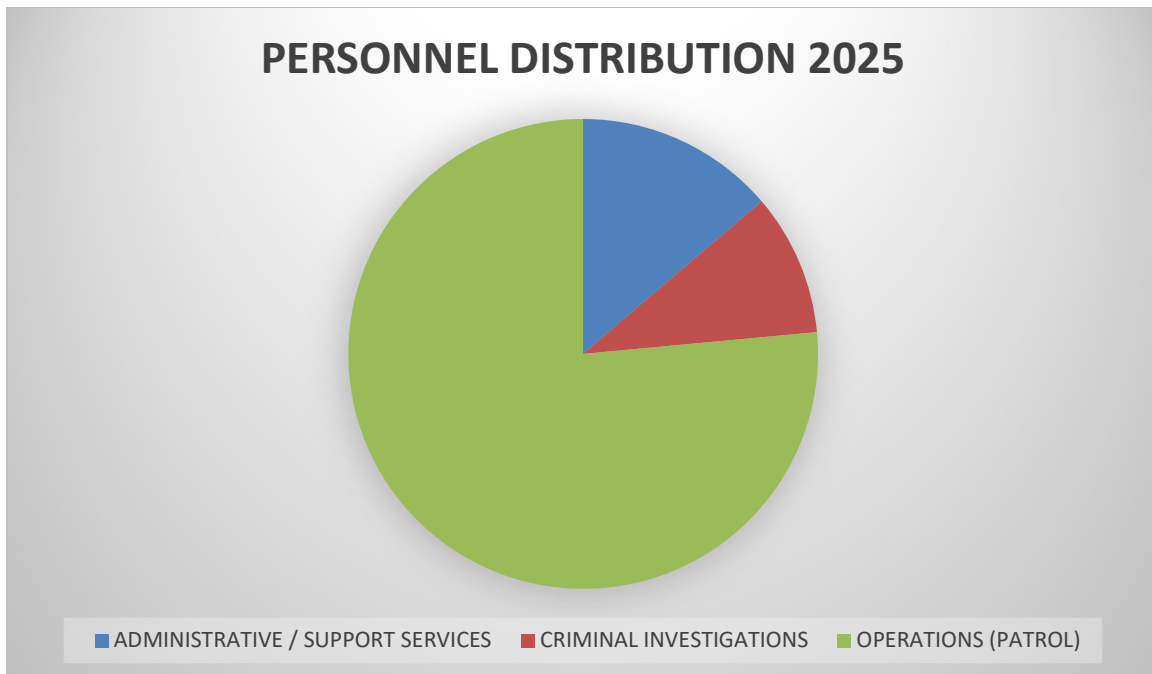

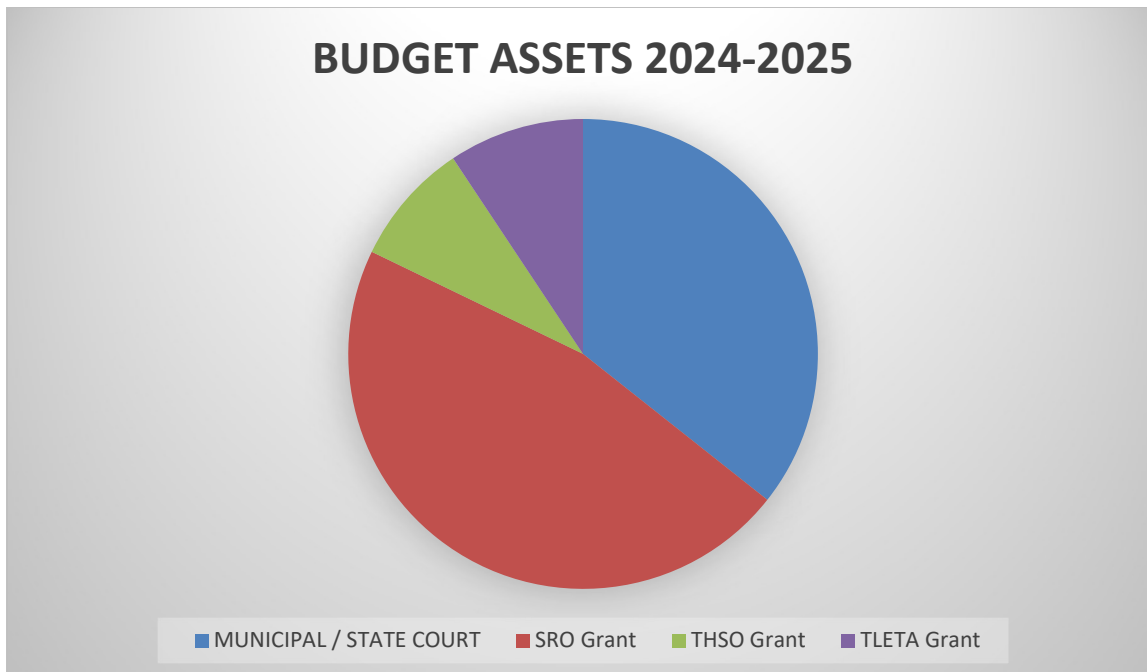

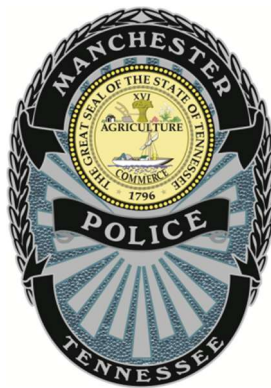

OPERATIONS (PATROL) DIVISION

The Manchester Police Department patrol division is divided into four shifts, each of which is commanded by a shift Captain. The shift Captain serves as commander to a shift Sergeant and five patrol officers. The patrol Captain reports directly to the Major. The patrol division works 12-hour shifts. Ending 2025, there were a total of 30 positions, 28 full-time, and 2 part-time in the patrol division. The patrol division provides service 24 hours per day to the City of Manchester. The operations (patrol) division is under the direction of the Major Mitchell West.

Officers assigned to patrol respond to initial calls for service, complete incident reports, work traffic accidents, provide traffic enforcement, make necessary arrests and work numerous community-oriented events. The patrol division also participates in all enforcement events and works closely with the Tennessee Highway Safety Office. All THSO events and enforcements are managed by the Administrative Captain Dale Robertson.

OPERATIONS (PATROL) DIVISION DISTRIBUTION

The Manchester Police Department patrol division consists of twenty-eight personnel. These personnel are distributed in the following order: four shift Captains, four shift Sergeants, twenty patrol officers.

Each officer works 80 hours in a two-week pay period or 2,080 hours per year. The total hours do not include overtime or lost time calculated from city benefits (sick time, vacation time).

Summary

During 2025, the department answered 22,275 calls for service, which reflects an increase of +14.03% from 2024. The patrol division constantly strives to keep the roadways as safe as possible. In 2025, the Manchester Police Department issued 776 speeding citations, 76 seatbelt citations, 495 no insurance citations, 1483 citations for other traffic violations and made 54 DUI arrests. The police department worked 450 crashes in 2025. The police department continues to team up with the Tennessee Highway Safety Office, to detect and deter impaired drivers, specifically alcohol related. In our new grant year, we are focusing on enforcement of Tennessee driving under the influence laws.



School Resource Officer Program



The Manchester Police Department provides a SRO for each of our three Manchester city schools, this program is supervised by Administrative Captain Dale Robertson.

The mission of the SRO Program is the reduction and prevention of school-related violence and crime committed by juveniles and young adults. The SRO Program aims to create and maintain safe, secure, and orderly learning environments for students, teachers, and staff.

The SRO will serve as a positive role model to instill in students good moral standards, good judgment and discretion, respect for other students, and a sincere concern for the school community. The SRO will promote citizen awareness of the law to enable students to become better-informed and effective citizens while empowering students with the knowledge of law enforcement efforts and obligations regarding enforcement as well as consequences for violation of the law.

During the 2025 fall semester both elementary SRO's began teaching 4th & 5th grade students Life Skills Training by Botvin. The course promotes health and personal development. During School Safety week all SRO's and Captain Robertson taught a firearm safety class to all students K-8th grade.

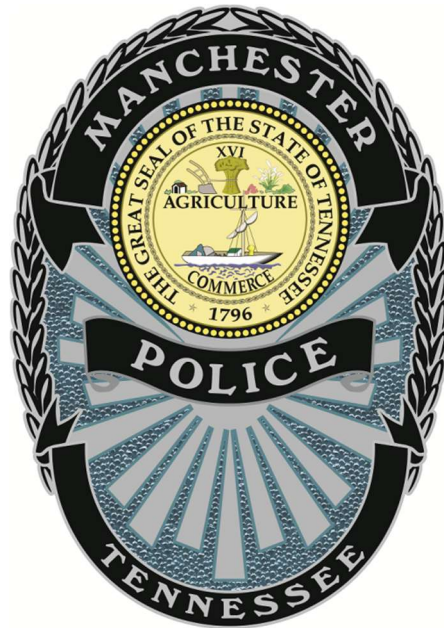

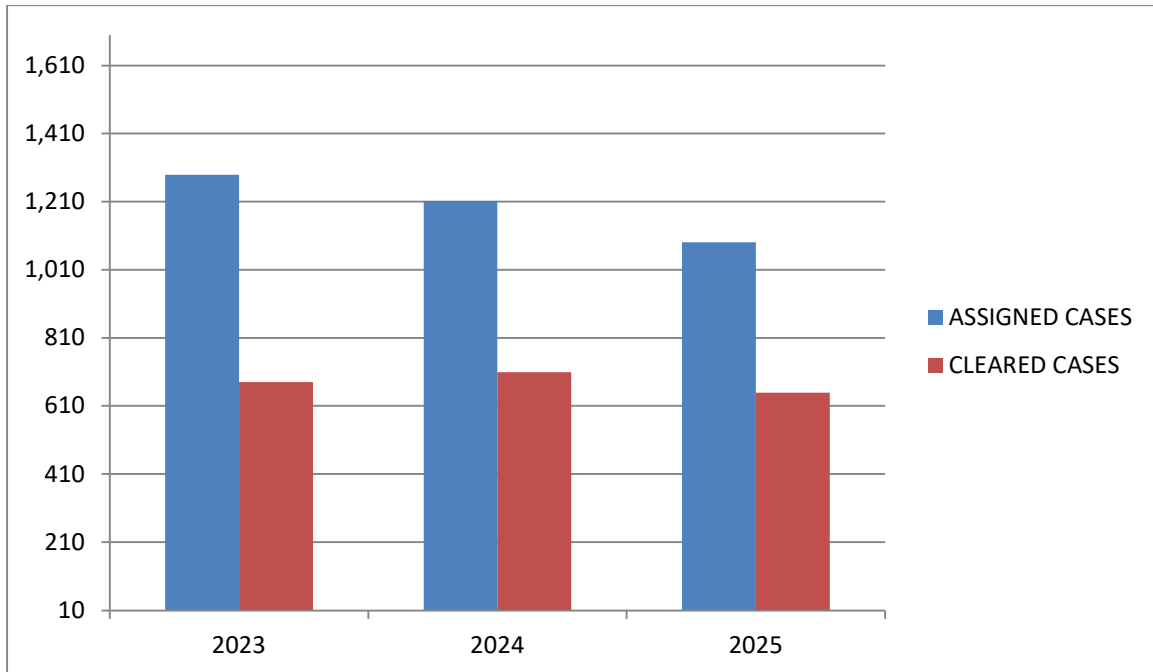

The Manchester Police Department Criminal Investigation Division (CID) is under the supervision of Chief Investigator Bryan Eldridge. CID is responsible for following up and investigating all crimes that occur within the city of Manchester. CID investigates cases that patrol does not solve along with all major crimes. CID also processes crime scenes along with collecting and preserving evidence. The Criminal Investigation Division also manages registering and maintaining sex offenders.

The Criminal Investigation Division (CID) collaborates closely with the Coffee County Sheriff's Department, Tullahoma Police Department, the Coffee County District Attorney Office, the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on complex criminal cases, leveraging their combined expertise and resources to tackle high-profile investigations. This partnership allows the CID to access specialized forensic analysis, advanced criminal databases, and intelligence-sharing platforms enabling more effective solutions to major crimes. By working together, these agencies ensure a comprehensive approach to justice, providing local, state, and federal support when facing particularly challenging or widespread criminal activities.

MANCHESTER POLICE DEPARTMENT TRAINING 2025

Officers at the Manchester Police Department must attend 40 hours of In-service training each year to remain in compliance with the Peace Officers Standards and Training. The 40 hours can be combined with general In-service hours along with specialized training. There are required courses that must be implemented during the 40 hours. The officers at Manchester Police Department completed 804 hours of specialized training in 2025. Every officer completed at least 40 hours of POST-required training. Most officers completed more than the required 40 hours. Manchester Police Department recorded 4,281 total hours of training during 2025.

The Manchester Police Department had 3 Officers complete their Basic Police Academy in 2025. A total of 1,503 total training hours were accumulated at the Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy.

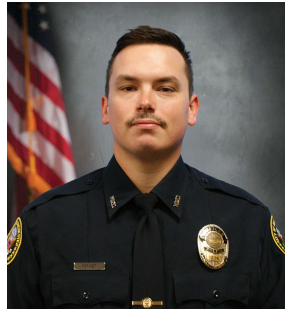

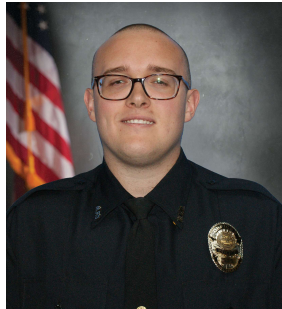

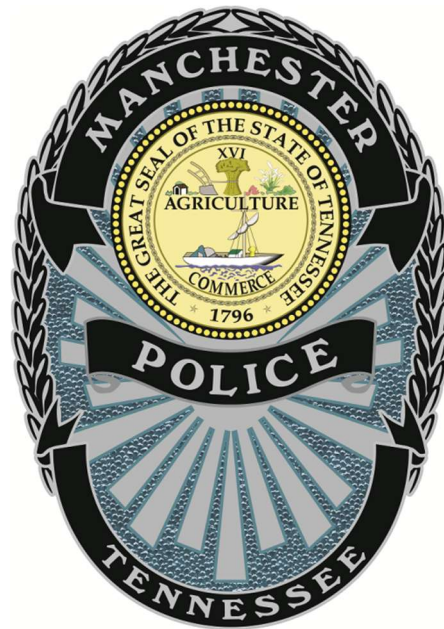
