

**ORDINANCE NO. 1628**

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, REPEAL AND DELETE CERTAIN SECTIONS OF  
MANCHESTER MUNICIPAL CODE WHICH ARE ARCHAIC, OBSOLETE,  
UNCONSTITUTIONAL OR OTHERWISE UNENFORCEABLE**

WHEREAS certain provisions of Manchester Municipal Code have been in effect for over forty (40) years; and

WHEREAS certain changes in State law, constitutional interpretation and infrastructure have rendered certain provisions of Manchester Municipal Code obsolete, unenforceable, unconstitutional or inapplicable; and

WHEREAS the University of Tennessee Municipal Technical Advisory Service has reviewed certain provisions and suggested same be repealed and deleted; and

WHEREAS review of other provisions by various City employees has revealed certain other provisions needless.

BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF MANCHESTER, TENNESSEE that the following Code Sections, or designated portions of which, be repealed and deleted from Manchester Municipal Code:

- 1-101 regarding meetings of the Board of Mayor and Aldermen; delete only the word “third.”**
- 3-301 relative to issuance of arrest warrants**
- 3-401 relative to appearance bonds**
- 3-403 relative to appearance bonds**
- 4-243 relative to employment; delete the final sentence**
- 6-103 regarding policemen carrying billy clubs**
- 6-105 regarding male citizens’ obligations to assist policemen**
- 6-106 regarding disposition of arrested persons**
- 9-102 prohibiting certain businesses from opening on Sunday**
- 9-509 relative to minors in pool rooms**
- All of Title 9 Chapter 6 relative to pinball machines**
- 10-106 delete only the word “dumb”**
- 11-201 relative to fortune telling**
- 11-501 relative to escape from custody or confinement**
- 11-603 delete the remaining language of the first sentence after “knucks”**
- All of Title 13 Chapter 4 relative to production and sale of milk**
- 13-505 relative to underground storage tanks; delete the first word “shall” and substitute the word “may”**

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF MANCHESTER, TENNESSEE that this ordinance shall take effect on and after its publication and passage, the public welfare of the City of Manchester, Tennessee requiring it.
